Kentucky River Community Care, Inc., (KRCC) is a private nonprofit Community Mental Health Center dedicated to improving the health and wellbeing of the people of our region. We help individuals and families in twelve counties in eastern Kentucky by providing mental health, developmental disabilities, substance abuse and trauma services. KRCC seeks to promote public safety, boost economic wellbeing and improve community and individual quality of life.

For over 50 years, KRCC has been addressing health issues by identifying needs, bringing people together, forming community partnerships, identifying resources to fund solutions and seeking changes in the overall health environment. KRCC has a team of over 750 experienced and caring service providers in over 60 operating sites across twelve counties.

KRCC provides client centered care designed to ensure that each individual gets the care and attention they need, in a manner that is sensitive to their desires. Our services include: assessment, referral, individual and group therapy, consultation, education, residential treatment, aftercare and case management. Our services are confidential and our priority is to serve our clients, care for their health and honor their individual rights. Transportation can even be arranged for many of our programs.

We collaborate with local organizations on innovative solutions, to pool our resources to serve the region. Our work often influences local, state and national policy. KRCC also consistently reinvests in the area through its reliance on local vendors and service providers.

CRISIS CARE:

SUBSTANCE ABUSE & MENTAL HEALTH CARE:

In non-crisis situations, the best way to access our professional services is by contacting the Outpatient Clinics in your County.

We provide individual, group, family therapy and medication management services through licensed or credentialed professionals. Referrals and support through other agencies will be made as needed. Contacting the Outpatient Clinic in your county is the first step toward finding the care you need.

OPEN ACCESS

KRCC accepts Medicaid, Medicare, and most private insurance. We can help you sign up for expanded Medicaid and we can enroll you in the Health Benefit Exchange.

THE RISING CENTER

The Rising Center provides support to survivors of all forms of sexual violence: sexual assault, sexual abuse and sexual harassment. These services include a 24-hour crisis line, medical advocacy, legal advocacy and individual, group, family and/or group counseling. The Rising Center also offers community education and a volunteer program.

Substance Abuse

KRCC is a recognized community partner that provides a liaison between individuals, the court system, law enforcement and other community partners dealing with substance abuse.

REGIONAL PREVENTION CENTER

The KRCC Regional Prevention Center provides consultation, training, education and technical assistance to community members, service providers, church and civic groups, in the planning and implementation phases of substance abuse prevention strategies.

The Resource Library at the Prevention Center offers an extensive selection of materials and curriculum on substance abuse prevention and treatment, violence prevention, conflict resolution and other mental health related issues.

DUI PROGRAM

Assessments include a clinical interview, Kentucky Assessment Battery, **20-hour pre-treatment**, outpatient therapy (group and individual) and referral to residential treatment, if a higher level of care is needed or if another program is requested. **DUI services are offered at each KRCC Outpatient Office.** Referral by the courts or other DUI program is required.

DRUG COURT PROGRAM

These services include assessment, referral, individual and group therapy, consultation, education, residential treatment, after-care and case management for individuals determined eligible for Drug Court Services. **Referrals must be received from the court officer, usually following alcohol/drug related charges or testing positive on a drug screen.**

Programs for Families



The REBOUND Center is a Recovery Community Center offering a safe environment for adults in recovery to gather, find support, have fun and learn skills needed to improve their recovery. Support groups, short educational programs,

and fun activities are available. Families are welcome and some programs will be geared for them.

One of 11 Recovery Kentucky centers, **Hickory Hill Recovery Center, located in Knott County, is a peer-driven, residential recovery facility for men over age 18 seeking recovery from alcohol & other drugs.** The goal of our program is to provide life-sustaining and life-rebuilding services to those suffering from drug and alcohol addiction by integrating a peer-to-peer, 12-steps, self-help model that offers the tools for recovery and restores productive lives. Another goal is to reduce the isolation addicted persons feel from the community and from one another.

Designed to house 100 men, the facility consists of 68 efficiency apartments and two dormitory-style housing units. Referrals may come through the judicial system, social service systems, health care systems, and various other entities. Clients may be homeless, in fear of homelessness, or unable to return to their families. Our purpose is to raise community awareness and activism to aid in the development and sustainability of our program.

WINTERBERRY

Our **Winterberry Recovery House**, located in Hazard, offers structured, safe, and sober housing for men ideal for long-term recovery. While near several town amenities, the home is nestled in an area that provides privacy.

At Winterberry, those new to sobriety have valuable support in the development of recovery and coping skills. House rules are peer-led, and tenants are required to attend self-help and 12-step meetings, as well as complete daily and weekly chores. The peer-led approach is designed to support and help reintegrate residents into the community, family life, and workplace. Individual stays vary, but generally average 9 to 12 months.



Hollyberry Recovery House, located in Hazard, offers a unique recovery opportunity to any woman with the desire to stay sober. Hollyberry offers structured, safe, and sober living and education to women seeking recovery from addiction to drugs and alcohol.

While providing for her basic needs – food, shelter, and safety – Hollyberry House allows a woman to focus solely on her recovery with peer-led support, direction, and guidance through a blend of 12-step recovery, life and career training, volunteerism, and therapeutic interventions. Our objective is to support them by providing a safe atmosphere where they can build a foundation and ongoing support to last a lifetime. Individual stays vary, but generally average 9 to 12 months.



Juneberry provides a structured, safe, and supportive living environment ideal for achieving long-term recovery.

At Juneberry, those new to recovery have valuable support in the development and practice of recovery and coping skills. House rules are peer-led and tenants are required to attend self-help and 12 step meetings, as well as counselling.

The peer-led approach is designed to support and help reintegrate you into the community, family life, and the workplace.

Everyone contributes to the daily upkeep of the home and learns skills needed to achieve long-term recovery.

Structured Recovery Housing for Women

Children's Services

Individual, group, family therapy and medication management services are provided for children, adolescents and adults. Licensed professionals (including psychiatrists, psychologists and clinical social workers) are available at KRCC clinics, schools and other designated sites within the community. Parent and child support groups, art and expressive therapies are also available.

KRCC conducts comprehensive psychological assessment for treatment planning and diagnostic clarification. We also provide evaluations to respond to court orders to assess competency and dangerousness or to assist with placement in foster care, for residential treatment.

CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS SCHOOL-BASED THERAPY

School-Based Therapy is a service provided by a KRCC School-Based Therapist and delivered at a particular school. This program offers the majority of therapeutic services for youth regarding mental health and/or substance abuse issues, within the school they attend such as; attending to mental health emergencies, working with families and other agencies to meet the needs of the youth, referring clients to other services as necessary, reporting abuse and neglect when necessary to the Dept. of Community Based Service Division of Protection and Permanency.

CHILDREN WITH SEVERE EMOTIONAL DISABILITIES [SED]

Family network facilitators are available to all parents with children that have a disability. The facilitator provides families with individual and group support, training, information and advocacy. These services may be provided within the home, the school or other community sites convenient for the families.

IMPACT

(Inter-agency Mobilization Program for Adolescent and Child Treatment) provides resource development and service coordination to children and their families who have been accepted into the IMPACT program by the Regional Inter-Agency Council. The program provides support to a child in the least restrictive environment possible and establishes a community support system.

EARLY CHILDHOOD MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM

The Early Childhood Mental Health Program was created to promote the social and emotional development of young children ages birth to five.

Early Childhood Mental Health Specialists provide assessments of mental health needs of children, age birth to five currently within the region. We provide therapeutic treatment services to children and/or their families. We collaborate with other service providers to assess the needs of children and their families. We foster community awareness of the need for mental health services. We provide outreach and instructional programs to caregivers and families through public and private child care centers and other organizations/providers.

SUMMER SPLASH

KRCC also offers an intensive summer program of therapeutic interventions, social skill practice activities and learning opportunities for children and youth with severe emotional disabilities. This is a special school-based summer program for children who receive therapeutic services during the school year.



RECLAIMING FUTURES

Works to ensure an integrated system of care for youth involved with, or who are at-risk of, involvement with the courts because of substance abuse through a grant funded by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. The program works to provide links between the legal community, service providers and community partners.



S.K.Y.E.S. Community Supports Associates (CSAs) provide community support services to children diagnosed with a mental health disorder or co-occurring disorder with the primary diagnosis of mental health disorder and one or more of the following: substance use disorder, intellectual disability, or physical health.

Comprehensive Community Support Services are activities/services necessary to allow children to live with maximum independence in the community.



KRCC's **Treehouse Academy** offers a fun-filled therapeutic after-school program designed for children ages 6-13.

They have food, fun activities, computers, video games, board games, outings and more!

Children learn how to navigate life by participating in skill training activities, groups and outings which are designed to help with daily challenges.

THE SAPLING CENTER



The Sapling Centers, our youth drop-in centers, are safe, welcoming, and inclusive places for youth ages 14 to 25 to spend time and be themselves.

We strive to create a positive, supportive, and fun environment for our young people, where they feel less alone in the world. Offering transition-aged youth services, the Centers are here to give youth support as they gain skills, meet new people, set goals, and work to achieve them. The goal is to make a positive difference in the health and life of the region's young people by teaching them to be self-sufficient, avoid risky behavior, and become capable adults.

All services are free, and youth need not have any previous experience with mental health services to be a member. We provide individual counseling, group therapy, life skills training, youth groups, and fun/educational activities.

Additionally, our Centers provide food, computer labs, lending libraries, games, and workshops on cooking, careers, job skills, finding housing, personal finance, and health.

Adult Services

OUTPATIENT THERAPY

KRCC's outpatient therapist provides needed services to help clients live safer and more independent lives by targeting the issues limiting the client's participation in daily activities such as self-care tasks, cooking, budgeting and managing finances, and medication management. In order to restore the client's functional skill for independent living, the therapist works individually with clients from all age groups who are experiencing a decline in their levels of safety or independence or are recovering from an illness or injury. Additional services include teaching clients balance and functional mobility, strengthening, daily living skills, community integration, safety awareness (home and community), cognitive skills training, coping skills, sensory integration therapy, hygiene, coordination, fine and gross motor skills, and social skills.

CASE MANAGEMENT

KRCC provides Case Management services to assist consumers with their medical, education, social and other support needs. Recipients must have a diagnosis of a serious mental illness or a substance use disorder and not be in immediate danger to themselves or others. They must not be actively using substances.

HEALTH AND WELLNESS CENTERS

KRCC's Health & Wellness Centers offer a variety of specialized services for adults with a Serious Mental Illness (SMI) - depression, psychosis (including schizophrenia), bipolar disorder, and post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) - in a caring and supportive environment. Services include therapy, community support activities, case management, peer support, housing, and supported employment. Currently, there are six centers, all of which are situated close to KRCC outpatient offices: Mayking (Letcher County), Hindman (Knott County), Hazard (Perry County), Campton (Wolfe County), Jackson (Breathitt County), and Booneville (serving Lee and Owsley counties).

Adult Services

MOVING BEYOND DEPRESSION

This program is a home visiting program providing In-Home Cognitive Behavior Therapy for pregnant women, or women up to 18 months post partum with a diagnosis of Major Depressive disorder. All clients are referred by the HANDS home visitors with the local health departments. This program allows a licensed, Masters level therapist to provide 15 sessions of In-Home CBT to women who are suffering from maternal or post-partum depression. Sessions are 1 hour per week for 15 weeks, with a Booster session 1 month later.

SOLUTIONS

Solutions works with other community agencies in a professional team setting to provide quality complete treatment. Solutions is a program for women that provides compassionate, innovative, and quality client care in a safe and supportive environment. Intensive treatment is offered for women addicted to alcohol and/or other drugs who may also be struggling with mental health, trauma, and/or behavioral health issues. Women are empowered to obtain their optimal health. Education related to personal and family safety is offered as well as access to Domestic Violence Advocacy services.

PROJECT A.D.D.V.A.N.C.E.

Offers an intensive outpatient program of comprehensive treatment services to women who have experienced domestic violence, substance abuse, childhood abuse or other trauma. The program serves women who may not need, or who are stepping down from, hospitalization and require more intensive care than regular outpatient services can offer. Project A.D.D.V.A.N.C.E. is located near Hazard, Kentucky.

Adult Services

KRCC's Assertive Community Treatment Teams [ACT]

Assertive Community Treatment is a team treatment approach designed to provide comprehensive, community-based psychiatric treatment, rehabilitation, and support to persons with serious and persistent mental illness such as schizophrenia.

Services are provided by a team of professionals with backgrounds in social work, rehabilitation, counseling, nursing and psychiatry. ACT is an evidenced based practice that has been extensively researched and evaluated for effectiveness.

KRCC has one ACT Team serving all 8 counties

Community Support

KRCC Community Support Associates (CSAs) assist with comprehensive community support services, which are activities necessary to allow clients to live with maximum independence in the community. Our goal is to assist individuals with disabilities in living as independently and with the highest quality of life possible. Services include skills training, cueing, medication adherence support, assistance in learning about/recognizing symptoms, education regarding side effects of medication, assistance in accessing community resources, emotional regulation skills development/practice, crisis management/development of crisis coping skills, developing/enhancing interpersonal skills, teaching parenting skills, teaching how to shop, and managing finances.

Developmental and Intellectual Disabilities



KRCC provides a broad array of programs to meet the needs of adults with intellectual or developmental disabilities. These programs and services are designed to:

- Provide services for adults with intellectual disabilities who are 18 years or older.
- Educate each individual on the issues of abuse and neglect so they can protect themselves.
- Educate the public about persons with intellectual disabilities and inspire them to accept each person within their community.
- Assist the medical professionals within the community in understanding the persons we serve.
- Help individuals in obtaining the medical assistance they require to live happy and healthy lives.

DID Services

RESIDENTIAL SERVICES

Our goal at the “Journeys” Program is to provide a supportive home environment within the community for the people we serve and to assist them with achieving independent living skills.

- We serve individuals in all eight counties of the Kentucky River Region.
- We provide residential homes in which we serve up to three individuals.
- Each of our Residential Houses include 24-hour per day staffing.

ADULT DAY HABILITATION

Available in Letcher, Breathitt and Perry counties. Program Opportunities include:

- Vocational Skills
- Socialization Skills
- Survival Skills
- Budgeting Skills
- Banking Skills
- Physical Fitness Activities
- Opportunities to travel and experience other communities

SUPPORTED EMPLOYMENT

We match and encourage the individual’s skills with proposed job duties and the employers with the individuals. Each individual has an on-site job coach to assist them in their duties. The job- coach encourages good work ethics. The job-coach is provided at no cost to the individual or the employer. We follow up with the individual and the employer to ensure the placement is appropriate and the individual is accomplishing his/her duties. Work independence is the key for the individuals in our program. We inspire each individual to work independently within his/her community.

CONSUMER DIRECTED OPTION

Consumer Directed Option (CDO) gives Medicaid waiver members more choices in the way some of their Medicaid services are provided. With CDO, you can choose who will provide the services that you need, as well as how, when and where the services will be provided.

SUPPORTS FOR COMMUNITY LIVING

Supports for Community Living (SCL) waiver provides adult day training, community living supports, respite and supported employment for persons with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities.

MICHELLE P. WAIVER

Michelle P. (MP) waiver is a combination of the HCB and SCL waivers. It provides adult day training, attendant care, community living supports, homemaker, personal care, respite and supported employment for persons with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities.

SUPPORTED COMMUNITY LIVING [SCL]

Provides 24-hour supervision and training in activities such as laundry, routine household care, self-care, shopping, money management, and socialization and leisure activities. No more than three individuals receiving waiver services can live in any single residential setting.

Housing Services

Housing Services

INDEPENDENT LIVING

Since 2007, we have developed several apartment complexes, including:

- Lilac Court Apartments in Letcher County.
- Dogwood Square in Perry County.

TOWNVIEW

A 17-unit apartment building in Breathitt County that provides independent living for people with intellectual/developmental disabilities, who have the skills necessary to live independently and require limited assistance with daily living skills.

Rental Assistance

The KRCC Rental Assistance Program works with individuals and families with housing needs in Breathitt, Knott, Lee, Leslie, Letcher, Owsley, Perry, or Wolfe County. These needs can range from keeping power on in an elderly person's home to placing a homeless family in an affordable rental unit. KRCC aims to prevent and end chronic homelessness.

Our services are available to qualifying individuals and families who are homeless, fleeing domestic violence, mentally ill, or at imminent risk of homelessness. KRCC gives preference to families with children, those who are fleeing domestic violence, veterans, those who are suffering from serious mental illness, the chronically homeless, and those with disabilities. These identified groups are some of the most vulnerable but no eligible applicant will be denied service. Anyone seeking assistance can fill out an application at any of the KRCC Outpatient offices.

All of our residential communities are surrounded by scenic mountain views, and most of our apartments are conveniently located within walking distance of businesses, services, and recreation such as grocery stores, shopping areas, doctor's offices, parks, schools, social services, churches, restaurants, literacy programs, libraries, banks, and pharmacies.
